## **MY PAINT LICK CHRISTMAS MEMORIES**

We always put up a real Christmas tree at church and I know you remember icicles; we had those on our tree too. And the wonderful smell of that tree. If I think hard enough I can almost smell it to this day. I know James L. French (he is my neighbor, Christian friend, just a wonderful person) was allergic to those Christmas trees so he couldn't be at church when we had the tree up. Everybody put their presents under the tree to be passed out at the end of the night. Our tree wasn't anything fancy and we had the most fun during these times at church.

We always had a Christmas play at Paint Lick on Christmas Eve...no matter what day of the week it was. We had curtains that were hung on a wire that went from one side of the church to the other and we had to have two people slide them open and close. I only remember two of the Christmas plays. The first was when I was probably 12 or 13 years old and Gary Noell was my brother. I was so scared of him. I was afraid to talk to him. I assume I got over it and all was well. Gary left this life way too young but I can see him standing there just like it was yesterday. The other play I remember was when I was much older, say 18??? An optimist and a pessimist were needed and I played the optimist and David Morris (we were dating then) played the pessimist. So, of course, to this day, I remind him that he is, I mean, was the pessimist in the play. I could memorize lines so easy back then, not so much now.

There was always a nativity scene. Ralph Thomas, Jr. played Joseph and his wife Betty was Mary and they played these parts for several years. If you remember them, you'll also remember that if you could picture in your mind what Mary and Joseph looked like, Ralph and Betty would instantly come to mind. That's how I remember it. In 1974 David and I were Joseph and Mary in the nativity scene and Chad had just been born the end of November. He was Baby Jesus in the manger but he squirmed quite a bit so we had to keep a bottle in his mouth the whole time.

To end the night, we had a visit from Santa and he brought a bag of treats for each person.

All these memories were in the old church. Progress is good but memories are even better.

Dear Paint Lick,

November 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2010

Hello there my dear brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus. As I constantly receive cards, letters of support and encouragement, prayers, etc from up that way I thought I'd write and share with you what's been going on around here and been on my heart and mind. You see last month was full of encounters with Jesus Christ and the love, grace and mercy of our God in heaven.

First, I'm in a program called "'Bridge.'" You have to apply and get accepted to attend and what it is is a Bible-Faith based program to help transition from prison (where I live) to the outside world (where you live). It's made up of 5 classes in 4 days and a daily walk with Jesus. On Mondays its "Celebrate Recovery" class, Tuesday is mentor night, Thursday Jobs for Life class, Friday and in-depth Bible study on Luke and a relationship class and then Church on Sunday. All these as I said are based on the Bible. The thing that amazes me is that these people faithfully are here every week to come be with us. Each individual in the program has a separate mentor, mine is from Trimble/Henry county, and great Christian guy. I trust him and can talk to him about anything and like I said unless something major occurs he is here every week. The Jobs for Life teachers are small business owners that teach us about getting a job, preparing a resume, interviewing skills, filling in the gaps of employment, etc. They help us to recognize our God given talents and find careers that highlight those talents. Between Jobs for life and our mentor night we create a plan for our release, a plan that includes everything, our walk with Christ (Christian Life), our family life, and employment, just everything. And it's our personal plan that is written down and then when finished they type it up and make copies for us to give to certain people that will help us stay on track and hold us accountable, plus it's a great thing to take to the parole board. This program and these people are great and they are teaching me so much, it really shows me God at work.

Second, twice a year a group of volunteers come in and hold a R.E.C. (Residents Encounter Christ) weekend. It's a very powerful weekend filled with testimonies, worship and praise to our Father in heaven. It doesn't matter what your reason for attending is, being as they feed you good over there, your going to come back with something or more of what you've already got. It's amazing to me that these people come and spend three days with us, to share and learn about Christ, without even knowing us. They come with genuine love and concern and that's definitely God at work again.

Last but not least I was chosen with two other inmates to go to Kennedy Alternative School in Louisville to speak to a group of troubled kids about bad decisions. These kids are in 8<sup>th</sup> grade and below and have made the decision to break the rules and ended up there for a stint of time. We told our stories and about how one or a series of bad decisions landed us in the penitentiary. We told them how bad this place is and how horrible it is to be away from your loved ones and how if they make better choices now they'll never have to experience that. As we spoke and the kids listened and asked questions, God started to talk to me that day and throughout the week. And then during Bible study class on Friday it hit me, Jesus said, (Luke9:23) "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross and follow me." So if I make the

decision to do that each morning, He is faithful to guide me. That if I live by His promises, (Joshua 1:5) No one will be able to stand up against me all the days of my life. As He was with Moses, so He will be with me, He will never leave me, nor forsake me." Make it personal put your name in there. (1<sup>st</sup> John 1:9) says, if I confess my sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive me my sins and purify me from all unrighteousness. Jti (Hebrews 13:5) Jesus said, "Keep your lives from the love of money and be content with what you have because God has said, "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you." In (Matthew 28:20) Jesus said, "And surely I am with you always to the very end of age." (1<sup>st</sup> John 5:15) says, that if we know that He hears us, whatever we ask, we know that we have what we asked of Him, along with (John 14:13-14) that He will give us what we ask of Him. He will not let us be tempted more than we can bear and He will provide us a way out is what (1<sup>st</sup> Corinthians 10:13) talks about. (2<sup>nd</sup> Thessalonians 3:3) reads, But the Lord is faithful, and He will strengthen and protect me from the evil one. There are more promises all throughout the Bible which stands for, your Basic Instructions Before Leaving Earth. (1<sup>st</sup> John 2:25, James 2:5, Galatians 3:29, Psalms 85:8/67:6-7 and more)

In the following passages it speaks of God keeping His promises and of His faithfulness and how through Christ His promises are fulfilled. (2<sup>nd</sup> Peter 1:3-4, 3:9, 1<sup>st</sup> Thessalonians 5:24, Hebrews 10:23, 2<sup>nd</sup> Corinthians 1:18,20, 1<sup>st</sup> Kings 8:56 and more) God shared this with me and I'm pleased to share it with you. I hope that you get something out of it. I've learned a lot down here and continue to learn everyday.

All this brings me to this conclusion, "I'm not thankful for the tragedy in my life and would do anything to change it, but I am eternally thankful for what has come out of the tragedy." God Bless you all and I hope this finds you well. You will remain in my prayers each day. Happy Holidays to you all.
