KENTUCKY RACEWAY MINISTRIES

“Drama Queens for the King”

“While they were worshipping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, ‘Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.’” (Acts 13:2 NIV) When the Holy Spirit brings together people to do God’s work, He doesn’t mess around. He certainly didn’t mess around when He brought together Cindy Richmond and Jackie Apted.

Jackie Apted, a chaplain for Kentucky Raceway Ministries and at Lawrenceburg Speedway, went to the National Fellowship of Raceway Ministries training in Tennessee in January 2010. While there she attended the “Drama Queens for the King” breakout session. Upon her return home, she talked to John Roberts about doing the ministry at Kentucky Speedway. “I really wanted someone else to do it,” she says, “but no one stepped up.” She then posted on Facebook that she felt called to start a ministry serving God’s people in which she would paint nails.

Cindy Richmond read the post. Cindy, who had been doing nails in a salon, had “a tremendous amount of nail supplies.” She thought God wanted her to give the supplies to Jackie, but when the two of them discussed the ministry at their church, Cindy discovered that God wanted her to be a part of it also.

Polishing nails at the Speedway campground gives the two ladies opportunities to tell women about “God’s love and His desire to get to know each and every one of them.” Christian music plays constantly, and the ministry provides free Christian books and other resources donated by various people and churches. There is also a small wading pool with water, rocks and Calgon in it where ladies can rest their weary feet.

“God placed that ministry in my heart at NFRM training,” says Jackie who states that the training sessions are important. “God wasn’t just using this ministry to reach others.” says Cindy, “He was also urging me to drop my training wheels and step out in faith and follow where He leads me.”

May we all do the same.
